Tequila

Exclusively made from the blue agave plant, it carries a rich cultural heritage shaped by strict regulations. To be classified as tequila, it must be produced in specific regions of Mexico, primarily in the state of Jalisco. Interestingly, there are over 1,000 different brands of tequila, but only a select few adhere to traditional production methods, which involves slow cooking the agave hearts in stone ovens to enhance their flavor.



Mexico

Tu blanco – 40% (Origin: Jalisco) 8

Description: A harmonious, terroir-blended tequila using both highland and lowland agave for a balanced profile

Tasting notes: A baked agave profile with refreshing hints of citrus and smooth vanilla

Don Fernando reposado – 38% (Origin: Jalisco) 12

Description: Made using traditional methods, with agave slow cooked in brick ovens and distilled in copper stills

Tasting notes: Sweet on the palate with a soft, tropical pineapple flavor, evolving into zesty citrus

Herencia mexicana añejo - 40% (Origin: Jalisco) 12

Description: Double distilled and aged for 3 years in bourbon casks, achieving a sophisticated character

Tasting notes: Subtle layers of chocolate, banana, caramel, and spice, with hints of cloves and pepper

Don Julio añejo - 38% (Origin: Jalisco) 14

Description: Aged in small batches for 18 months in American oak barrels, delivering exceptional complexity. Don Julio's Agave plants grow for at least 10 years before the harvest

Tasting notes: Rich notes of caramel, vanilla, toasted oak, and dried fruit, with a warm, smooth finish

Casa dragones blanco– 40% (Origin: Jalisco) 18

Description: Crafted from 100% Blue Agave, this silver tequila embodies the pure essence of tequila

Tasting notes: A refined balance of semi-sweet agave notes, complemented by warm undertones of pepper and cloves

Don Julio 1942 – 38% (Origin: Jalisco) 25

Description: Premium añejo tequila, aged for at least 2.5 years in oak barrels, offering rich flavors of caramel, vanilla, and roasted agave. Known for its smooth, elegant finish, it's a favorite for sipping or refined cocktails

Tasting notes: Offers smooth notes of caramel, vanilla, roasted agave, toasted oak, and a long, elegant finish with hints of spice



Sotol

Sotol is a traditional Mexican spirit distilled from the Dasylirion plant, also known as “desert spoon.” It is primarily produced in Chihuahua, Durango, and Coahuila, Mexico. Unlike tequila and mezcal, which come from agave, sotol is made from a different desert plant that takes around 15 years to mature.

The production process is similar to mezcal: the hearts of the plant (piñas) are roasted, fermented, and distilled. Sotol has an earthy, herbal, and slightly smoky flavor with peppery and grassy notes. It is known for its smooth, complex profile.



Mexico

Ono – 40% (Origin: Chihuahua, maestro sotolero Gerardo Ruelas) **12**

Description: This artisanal spirit is crafted from 100% Dasylirion cedrosanum plants, harvested in the valleys of the Coyame Desert. The production process involves traditional methods, including natural fermentation and double distillation in copper pots, resulting in a smooth and complex flavor profile

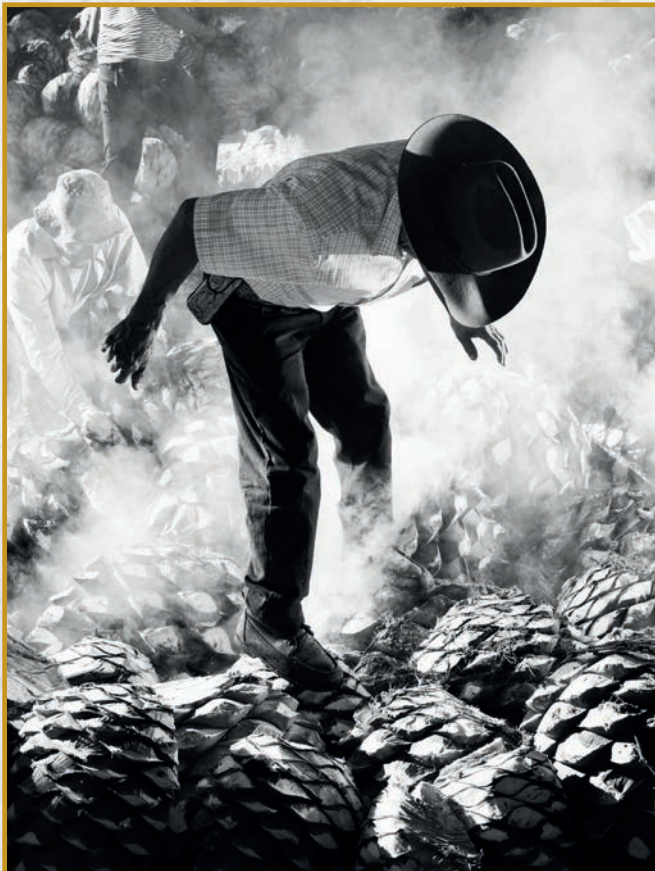
Tasting notes: Fresh and crisp, featuring flavors of guava, spicy pepper, and moist earth. Complex, with a lingering end of spices and minerality



Mezcal

Often overlooked in favor of tequila, is gaining recognition for its diverse flavor profiles and artisanal production methods.

Crafted from various agave species, mezcal is unique for its smoky flavor, a result of traditional roasting techniques in underground horno (pit). Unlike tequila, which must be made from blue agave, mezcal can be derived from over 30 different types, reflecting the terroir of its production regions and the skill of the distiller.



Mexico

Excomulgado chingon – 42%

(Origin: Ejutla, Oaxaca - Agave type: 100% Espadín Capón)

Description: Double distilled and traditionally crushed with a stone tahona pulled by a bull

Tasting notes: A captivating mix of spice and smoke, with earthy notes of wet hay and fresh green grass *Chef Nick's Favourite*

Pierde almas espadín – 49%

(Origin: San Luis del Río, Oaxaca - Agave type: Espadín)

Description: Small-batch production, naturally fermented agave, offering a distinct flavor profile

Tasting notes: Smoky and peppery, with subtle hints of chocolate and a savory, lingering finish

Pierde almas conejo - 52.1%

(Origin: San Luis del Río, Oaxaca - Agave type: Espadín)

Description: A unique triple-distilled mezcal infused with the essence of wild cottontail rabbit, which is hanged in the still during the third distillation

Tasting notes: A complex bouquet of orchard fruits, minty tarragon, and a whisper of smoky meat

Excomulgado tobalá - 48%

(Origin: Sola de la Vega, Oaxaca - Agave type: Tobilá)

Description: Tobilá agaves take between 7-12 years to reach maturity, mostly found in the wild, offering a truly unique flavour

Tasting notes: Sweet, ripe tropical fruits with a long, herbal, and citrusy aftertaste

Clase azul mezcal durango - 40%

(Origin: Durango - Agave type: Cenizo)

Description: Made from the rare Cenizo agave, native to the semi-arid highlands of Durango

Tasting notes: A rich combination of peanut, brown sugar, honey, wood, dark chocolate, and fig



Whiskey

Whisky (or whiskey) varies significantly depending on its country of origin, with distinct regulations governing its production. The spelling "whiskey" is typically reserved for Irish and American spirits, while "whisky" is used for Scottish and Canadian varieties, as well as Japanese whisky

Japanese Whisky has earned a prestigious place in the world of spirits, celebrated for its elegance and precision. Heavily influenced by traditional Scottish methods, Japanese distillers have added their own distinct approach, often emphasizing balance, purity, and subtlety. One unique element is the use of Mizunara oak for aging, a rare and fragrant wood native to Japan, which imparts delicate notes of sandalwood, spice, and incense. Japanese whisky is often known for its harmonious blend of flavors.



Scotland

Talisker 10 - 45% (Origin: Isle of Skye) **10**

Description: Crafted by the sea in the oldest distillery on the Isle of Skye since 1830, Talisker embodies maritime spirit

Tasting notes: A balanced sweetness of dried fruit and malt, finishing with a peppery sea breeze

Lagavulin 16 - 43% (Origin: Islay) **14**

Description: Known as the "King of Islay," this whiskey is aged in oak casks for at least 16 years, offering a deeply complex profile

Tasting notes: Bold peat smoke intertwined with malt, sherry, and an undercurrent of fruity sweetness

Signatory bunnahabhain 11 - 48% (Origin: Islay) **15**

Description: A 2012 vintage bottled by an independent distillery, matured in oloroso sherry casks

Tasting notes: Rich notes of chocolate, orange, coffee, and cloves

Bowmore 18 px sherry cask - 43% (Origin: Islay) **18**

Description: Aged in Oloroso and Pedro Ximénez sherry casks for a distinctive richness

Tasting notes: Sweet plum, smoky peat, Seville marmalade, and floral blossom

Bladnoch 11 - 46.7% (Origin: Lowlands) **15**

Description: Aged in bourbon casks, for at least 11 years. Bladnoch is one of Scotland's oldest independent distilleries

Tasting notes: Delicate vanilla, butterscotch, custard, and ripe cherries with hints of stewed pears

Auchentoshan three wood - 43% (Origin: Lowlands) **11**

Description: Aged in bourbon, Oloroso, and PX sherry casks, offering a multi-layered whiskey experience

Tasting notes: Rich cherry liqueur coated in dark chocolate, with ripe forest fruits



Scotland

Balvenie DoubleWood 12 – 40% (Origin: Speyside) **14**

Description: Matured first in American oak, then finished in European sherry casks, bringing depth and complexity

Tasting notes: Nutty sweetness, a touch of cinnamon spice, and a rich sherry layer

GlenAllachie 10 Ruby Port – 48% (Origin: Islay) **12**

Description: Aged for 10 years and finished in Ruby Port casks, creating a fruity, vibrant whiskey

Tasting notes: Orange zest, apricot, red berries, chocolate, and mocha

Macallan 12 Sherry Cask – 40% (Origin: Craigellachie, Moray) **20**

Description: Matured in hand-selected sherry casks from Jerez, Spain, for a luxurious and refined finish

Tasting notes: Dark chocolate, orange, cherries, dried fruit, oak spice, and a hint of nutmeg

Highland Park 12 – 43% (Origin: Highland) **10**

Description: Matured in American and European oak sherry casks, offering a well balanced character

Tasting notes: Bright notes of Seville oranges and rich fruitcake spiced with cinnamon

Oban 14 – 43% (Origin: Highland) **14**

Description: The exposure to the sea gives Oban its distinctive depth, shaped by the salty sea air

Tasting notes: A balanced blend of grape, pineapple chunks, and roasted nuts

Glenmorangie 16 Sweet Wine Cask Finish – 46% (Origin: Highland) **12**

Description: Aged for 16 years, finished in sweet wine casks for added complexity

Tasting notes: Honeyed orange syrup, buttery brioche, and a delicate spice



Scotland

Glengoyne 15 – 43% (Origin: Highland) **14**

Description: Aged primarily in sherry casks, bringing out its rich and spicy profile

Tasting notes: Black pepper, vanilla, and stewed apples, with a lingering warmth

Dalmore Port Wood Reserve – 44% (Origin: Highland) **16**

Description: A sophisticated blend, matured in ex-bourbon casks and finished in Tawny Port casks

Tasting notes: Red berries, caramel, and orange zest, layered with a sweet almond finish

U.S.A.

Buffalo Trace(Bourbon) – 40% (Origin: Frankfort, Kentucky) **8**

Description: A refined blend of various mash bills, aged to perfection in charred white oak barrels.

Tasting notes: Rich and velvety, with warm notes of toffee, dark fruits, and a touch of refreshing mint

Woodford Reserve Bourbon – 43.2% (Origin: Woodford County, Kentucky) **10**

Description: A distinguished small-batch bourbon from one of Kentucky's oldest and most respected distilleries

Tasting notes: Smooth and luxurious, with deep flavors of caramel, toffee, and a hint of dark chocolate

Bulleit rye – 45% (Origin: Lawrenceburg, Indiana) **10**

Description: With 95% rye, it is known for its high rye content. Aged in charred American oak barrels, it delivers a smooth yet complex flavor profile

Tasting notes: Rich and spicy with notes of vanilla, honey, dried fruit, and a peppery finish, complemented by hints of oak and toffee



The Netherlands

Millstone Peated PX – 46% (Origin: Baarle-Nassau) 10

Description: A unique combination of peated barley and the sweet richness of PX sherry casks.

Tasting notes: A harmonious blend of smoky peat, sweet sherry, dark berries, raisins, and warming spices like nutmeg

Gate One Single Malt – 50% (Origin: The Hague) 12

Description: Aged in a mix of new American oak and Buffalo Trace bourbon barrels, offering a nuanced flavor profile.

Tasting notes: Round and rich, with notes of cedar, coconut, butterscotch, and layers of ripe fruit

Millstone 92 Rye – 46% (Origin: Baarle-Nassau) 10

Description: Crafted from 100% rye grain and aged for 8 years in American oak barrels, delivering a full-bodied experience.

Tasting notes: Bold and robust, featuring warm spices, caramel sweetness, and a hint of dark fruit

Ireland

Jameson – 40% (Origin: County Cork) 8

Description: Triple distilled for a smooth finish, matured in both sherry and bourbon casks.

Tasting notes: A balanced profile of spice and nuttiness, with delicate hints of vanilla, sweet sherry, and mellow wood

Writers' Tears – 40% (Origin: Carlow) 9

Description: A fine blend of single malt and single pot still whiskeys, aged in bourbon casks for a refined character.

Tasting notes: Fresh and fruity, with notes of honey, vanilla, and a gentle touch of spice, balanced by malt sweetness



Ireland

Green Spot – 40% (Origin: County Cork) 10

Description: Aged between 7 and 10 years in bourbon and sherry casks, delivering a beautifully layered flavor.

Tasting notes: Crisp and clean, offering vibrant orchard fruits, creamy vanilla, and a sweet malt finish

Redbreast 12 – 40% (Origin: County Cork) 12.5

Description: Triple distilled in copper pot stills and matured for at least 12 years, showcasing a rich complexity

Tasting notes: Toasted nuts, warming cinnamon, cloves, and a deep sherry richness

Japan

The Chita Single Grain – 43% 15

(Origin: Chita Peninsula, Aichi Prefecture)

Description: A delicate, mainly corn-based whiskey, aged in wine, sherry, and bourbon casks for added depth.

Tasting notes: Light and elegant, with soft notes of honey, toffee, and a subtle hint of spice

Anjo Single Malt – 45% (Origin: The Niigata Distillery) 18

Description: A small-batch release aged in Mizunara oak casks, limited to just 3,000 bottles with a surprising flavor profile.

Tasting notes: Luxurious flavors of caramel, dried fruits, toasted nuts, and delicate spices.

Bartender's note: This whisky is quite outspoken, due to the maturation process in the Mizunara casks, that makes it not for everyone. You either love it or it's not for you

Hibiki Suntory – 43% (Origin: The Niigata Distillery) 10

Description: Aged in a mix of American white oak, sherry, and Mizunara oak barrels, offering a harmonious balance of flavors.

Tasting notes: Smooth and complex, with layers of honey, orange zest, white chocolate, and dark fruit



Gin

Gin's history begins with jenever, a Dutch spirit first crafted in the 16th century as a medicinal tonic. Made from malt wine fermented grain, often barley and flavored with juniper berries, jenever was initially believed to have health benefits.

In the 17th century, English soldiers encountered jenever during the Thirty Years' War in the Netherlands and brought the idea back to England. The English adapted the process, creating a lighter, more refined version which later became known as gin. One early production method was "bathtub gin", where raw, unrefined spirits were infused with botanicals in make-shift containers like bathtubs. This process skipped the essential step of discarding the heads and tails of the distillation, resulting in a harsh, rough product in some cases, deadly product. Despite its low quality, bathtub gin was an affordable alternative to more expensive spirits, contributing to the Gin Craze in 18th-century England.



The Netherlands

Rutte Celery – 43% (Origin: Dordrecht)

8

Description: Made with fresh celery in one of the oldest distilleries in the Netherlands, this gin delivers a truly unique flavor.

Tasting notes: Crisp and refreshing, with the bright flavor of fresh celery, balanced by zesty citrus and herbal notes

Bobby's Dry – 42% (Origin: Schiedam)

9

Description: A fusion of Dutch distilling heritage and Indonesian botanicals, creating a truly distinct gin.

Tasting notes: Bold juniper, with hints of pepper, citrus, cinnamon, and cloves, delivering a warming spice

Nolet's Dry Silver – 47.5% (Origin: Schiedam)

11

Description: A luxurious, modern gin with a focus on fresh, floral, and fruit-forward botanicals.

Tasting notes: Delicate peach, raspberry, and soft rose, balanced by light lavender and a touch of citrus

England

Opihr Spices of the Orient – 40% (Origin: Warrington)

9

Description: Inspired by the ancient spice route, this gin is infused with a mix of exotic botanicals.

Tasting notes: Warm and spicy, with black pepper, ginger, cumin, and cardamom, lifted by a hint of citrus peel



Scotland

Tanqueray No. Ten – 47.3% (Origin: Cameronbridge) **9**

Description: Made using whole fresh citrus fruits during distillation, delivering an invigorating and fresh taste.

Tasting notes: Bright and zesty, with flavors of grapefruit, lime, and orange, complemented by juniper and a touch of chamomile

Hendrick's – 44% (Origin: Ayrshire) **10**

Description: Infused with cucumber and rose petals, this gin stands out for its unique and refreshing character.

Tasting notes: Delicate and floral, with rose and cucumber blending effortlessly with juniper and citrus

Nàdar (Climate Positive) – 43% (Origin: Angus) **11**

Description: The world's first climate-positive gin, crafted sustainably from peas.

Tasting notes: Bright lemon zest, fresh grassy herbs, green pepper, and a touch of sweetness

Japan

Roku – 43% (Origin: Osaka, Japan) **9**

Description: Crafted with six unique Japanese botanicals, each representing a different season of the year.

Tasting notes: Bright, sweet citrus with herbal green tea notes and a subtle hint of sansho pepper

France

Citadelle Rouge – 44% (Origin: Cognac) **9**

Description: A vibrant gin infused with red fruits, creating a refreshing and fruity profile.

Tasting notes: Juicy flavors of raspberry, strawberry, and blackberry, with a soft, lingering sweetness



Belgium

Copperhead– 40% (Origin: Antwerpen) **10**

Description: Inspired by a 19th-century alchemist's quest for the elixir of life, this gin offers a balanced, intriguing mix of botanicals

Tasting notes: A perfect harmony of juniper, zesty citrus, cardamom, and coriander

Germany

Monkey 47 – 47% (Origin: Black Forest) **12**

Description: Made with 47 botanicals, including native ingredients from the Black Forest, this gin is renowned for its depth and complexity

Tasting notes: Bold juniper, fresh citrus, floral lavender, and a sweet touch of lingonberries



Jenever

Often regarded as the precursor to gin, is a traditional Dutch spirit that dates back to the 16th century.

It is made from malt wine giving it a distinct, earthy character with juniper berries as a key ingredient. Unlike gin, which evolved to become more botanical-forward, jenever maintains a maltier, fuller flavor not too far from whisky.

Young jenever is more similar to vodka but with the added ingredient of the juniper berry, while old jenever, containing between 15% and 50% malt wine, is smoother and ideal for those who find whisky too intense. For whisky lovers, 100% malt wine jenever offers a powerful, full-bodied experience. Like whisky it can be aged on a variety of casks.



The Netherlands

Bobby's Jong Jenever – 35% (Origin: Schiedam)

8

Description: A modern interpretation of the classic Dutch jenever, infused with Indonesian spices.

Tasting notes: Delicate citrus and herbs, complemented by warming spices and balanced juniper

Van Kleef Oude van Drie – 38% (Origin: The Hague)

10

Description: Aged in French oak barrels, this jenever contains a higher proportion of malt wine, offering a richer character

Tasting notes: Smooth malt, caramel, vanilla, and earthy juniper, with subtle hints of oak

Notaris Bartender's Choice – 42% (Origin: Schiedam)

10

Description: With a higher malt wine content, this jenever delivers a rich and complex flavor profile

Tasting notes: Robust malt, sweet vanilla, caramel, and juniper, with a gentle herbal undertone

Rutte Jenever Paradyswyn – 35% (Origin: Dordrecht)

12

Description: A unique blend of wine, malt wine, and botanicals, creating a slightly sweet yet refined jenever

Tasting notes: Sweet malt, fresh grape, juniper, and delicate spices



Rum

Rum's rich history is deeply rooted in maritime culture and the Caribbean, where it originated. Crafted from sugarcane juice or sugarcane byproducts like molasses, it is renowned for its versatility and depth of flavor

Among the finest examples is Guatemala's Zacapa, a distillery that ages its rum high in the mountains at 2,300 meters in the "House Above the Clouds." This unique, high-altitude setting slows the aging process, allowing rich, complex flavors to develop. Using a traditional solera system with barrels that once held American whiskey, sherry, and Pedro Ximénez wine, Zacapa creates a distinctive, layered profile celebrated worldwide.

Rhum, rum and ron originate from colonial times, each with its own distinctive characteristics and flavors. French-style rhum is known for its fruity, grassy notes, often made from fresh sugarcane juice. English-style rum tends to be herbal and bold, typically distilled with molasses for a rich, full-bodied flavor. Spanish-style ron, on the other hand, is generally smoother and sweeter and counts for around 80% of the world's rum consumption.



Jamaica

Rum-Bar Silver Pot Still – 40% (Origin: Park Estate)

Description: An unaged Jamaican rum, produced using traditional pot still methods for an authentic taste

Tasting notes: Vibrant notes of ripe banana, zesty citrus, and light vanilla, with a hint of pepper

Cuba

Ron Caney 7 – 38% (Origin: Santiago de Cuba)

9

Description: A premium Cuban rum aged for seven years, offering a smooth and mellow character

Tasting notes: Toffee, vanilla, dark chocolate, dried fruits, and a touch of smokiness

The Netherlands

Union 55 Botanical Rum & Sea Salt – 40% (Origin: Amsterdam)

Description: A distinctive spiced rum, infused with botanicals and a hint of sea salt

Tasting notes: Warm vanilla, nutmeg, cinnamon, and a subtle, savory brininess

Dominican Republic

Kirk and Sweeney Reserva – 40% (Origin: Puerto plata)

Description: A premium aged rum that embodies the rich and smooth flavors of the Caribbean

Tasting notes: Deep caramel, toffee, dried figs, and a subtle layer of spice

Heejoy Spiced Rum – 40% (Origin: Demerara) **9**
Description: A carefully crafted blend of Caribbean rums, enhanced with spices and herbs
Tasting notes: Sweet caramel, vanilla, nutmeg, and a hint of tropical fruits

Heejoy Origin – 40% (Origin: Demerara) **9**
Description: A blend of artisanal Caribbean rums, with a focus on Jamaican varieties for added depth.
Tasting notes: Tropical fruits, zesty citrus, and a touch of spice

Nicaragua

Flor de Caña 12 Year – 40% (Origin: Chichigalpa) **12**
Description: Sustainably produced and aged for 12 years, this rum is known for its exceptional smoothness
Tasting notes: Toffee, dark chocolate, roasted nuts, oak, and spice

Trinidad

Angostura 1824 – 40% (Origin: Port of Spain) **15**
Description: A premium blend of rums, aged for at least 12 years to achieve a rich, complex flavor
Tasting notes: Molasses, vanilla, chocolate, and a gentle touch of spice



Venezuela

Diplomatico Reserva Exclusiva – 40% (Origin: La miel) **12**
Description: Known for its rich, sweet character, this premium Venezuelan rum is smooth and indulgent
Tasting notes: Caramel, chocolate, dried fruit, and light spices

Guatemala

Ron Zacapa Solera 23 Gran Reserva – 40% **14**
(Origin: Sao Joao, La miel)
Description: Crafted using the solera method, blending rums aged between 6 and 23 years
Tasting notes: Dried fruit, vanilla, cinnamon, oak, and rich chocolate

Brazil

Avuá Prata – 40% (Origin: Minas Gerais) **10**
Description: A traditional cachaça made from freshly pressed sugar cane juice, highlighting authentic Brazilian flavors
Tasting notes: Fresh sugarcane, lime, and subtle herbal notes



Eau de vie

meaning “water of life” in French, is a clear fruit brandy made by fermenting and distilling fruits like apples, pears, or grapes.

Unlike flavored spirits, Eau de vie is unaged, allowing the fresh, natural flavors of the fruit to shine through. It’s typically served chilled and enjoyed as a digestif, offering a clean, smooth taste with a distinct fruity aroma.

Brandi

a spirit distilled from wine or fermented fruit juice, is often savored as an after-dinner indulgence. Aged in wooden casks, brandy develops a unique character that reflects the type of wood used during maturation. The term “brandy” originates from the Dutch word “brandewijn,” meaning “burnt wine,” referring to the distillation process. Renowned varieties like Cognac and Armagnac are held to strict regulations, elevating their status among connoisseurs.

Cognac

Cognac is a distinguished brandy produced exclusively in the Cognac region of France. To be labeled as such, it must undergo double distillation in copper pot stills and be aged for at least two years in French oak barrels. This spirit is categorized by age statements—VS (Very Special), VSOP (Very Superior Old Pale), and XO (Extra Old)—with the aging process enriching its flavors of dried fruit, oak, and spice. Celebrated for centuries by connoisseurs and royalty alike, Cognac’s distinctive character is shaped by the region’s unique chalky soil and climate.



Armagnac

Armagnac, often regarded as the rustic cousin of cognac, is France’s oldest brandy, with roots stretching back over 700 years in the Gascony region. Distilled once in a continuous column still, it boasts a richer, more robust flavor compared to cognac’s double distillation. Each bottle captures the region’s terroir, revealing notes of dried fruit, spice, and earthy complexity. Vintage Armagnacs are more prevalent, allowing enthusiasts to savor single-year releases that showcase each harvest’s unique qualities. With its artisanal production and extended aging in oak casks, Armagnac embodies a rich tradition and craftsmanship.



France

Montifaud VS Cognac Petite Champagne – 40% 8
(Origin: Cognac)

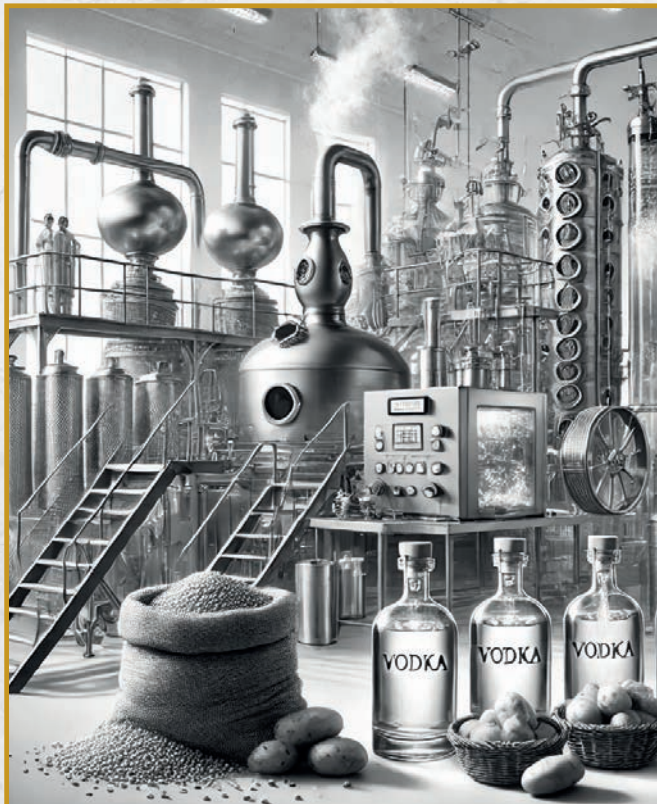
